C'est mon ami.	[sè mon na mi]	It is my friend.
C'est ton chat.	[sè ton cha]	It is your cat.
C'est son chien.	[sè son chi un]	It is his / her male dog.
C'est notre voiture.	[se no t r voua tu r]	It is our car.
Ce sont mes amis.	[se son mé za mi]	These are my friends.
Ce sont tes chats.	[se son té cha]	These are your cats.
Ce sont ses chiens.	[se son sé chi un]	These are his / her dogs.
Ce sont nos voitures.	[se son no voua tu r]	These are our cars.

ADDITIONAL VOCABULARIES

The following nouns are considered **irregular**,
because **they do not follow the standard rules**
regarding gender (**masculine** / **feminine**) or number (**singular** / **plural**).

There is no specific logic or "reason" behind this :

they are simply exceptions that must be memorized.

They are similar to other nouns we have already encountered, such as:

Un arbre (a tree)

Un livre (a book)

Un voyage (a trip/journey)
