OBJECT PRONOUNS (Part 1)

INTRODUCTION

In this lesson, we are going to learn about « PRONOMS COMPLÉMENTS ».

They are used to replace **SOMEONE** or **SOMETHING**
that we **mentioned previously**.

For instance :

I talk to **my friend**.
I will think about **your question**.
I bought some cake.



I talk to **him**.
I will think about **it**.
I bought **some**.

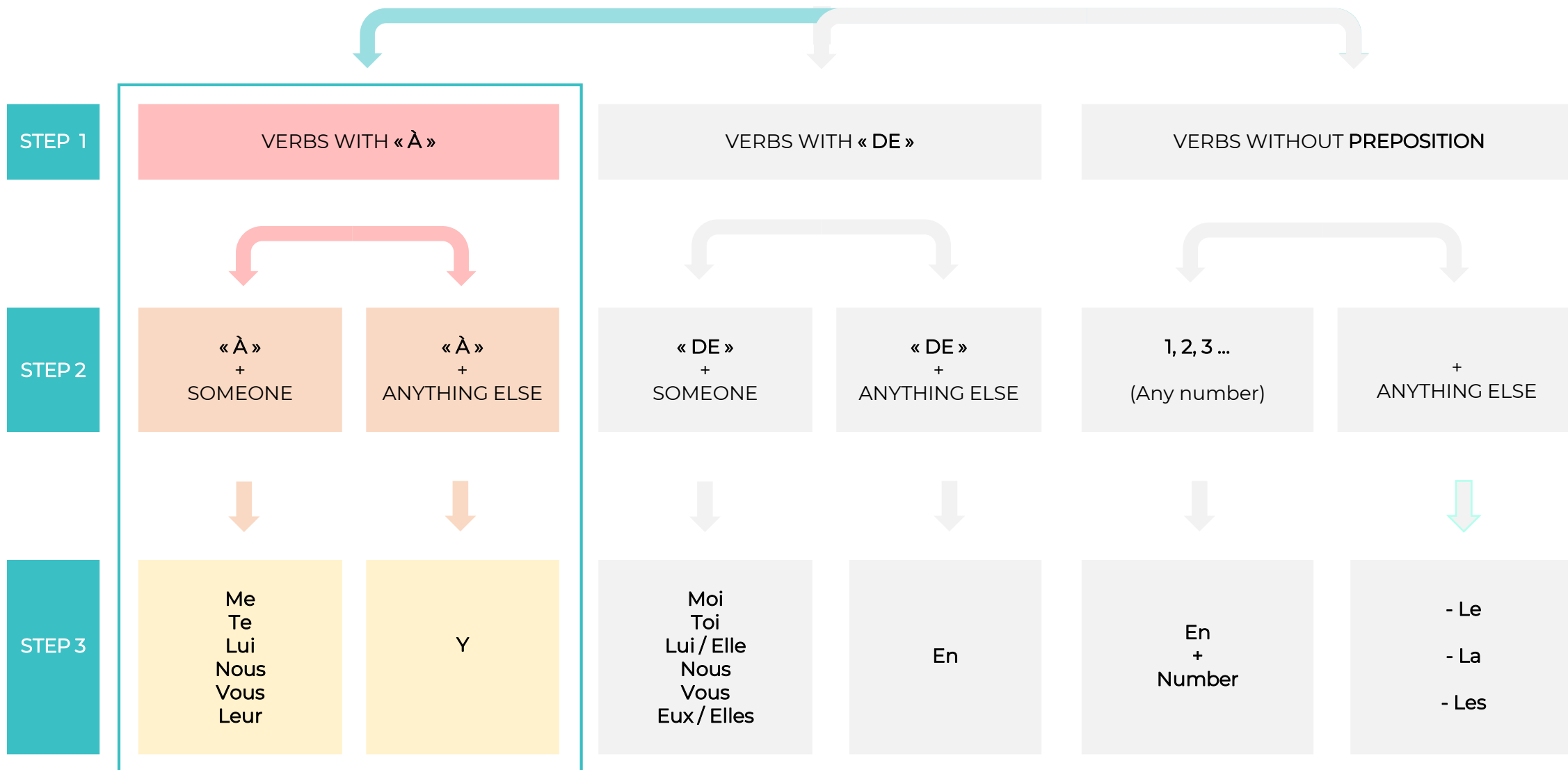
The « PRONOMS COMPLÉMENTS » (Object pronouns)
is one of the most advanced grammar concepts in French.
But don't worry, we have created **clear and simple steps**
that you can follow to make sure you are **always right**.

In this lesson, we are going to focus on the **FIRST WAY** to use these **pronouns**.

It is based on the following structure:

VERB + « À »

Let's take a look:



CASE #1: VERB + « À » + SOMEONE:

When referring to **SOMEONE**, use the following PRONOUNS

SUBJECT	PRONOUN	VERB	« À »	ANYTHING ELSE	MEANING
Je		parle.	à	mon frère	I talk to my brother.
Je	lui	parle.			I talk to him.

SUBJECT	PRONOUN	VERB	« À »	SOMEONE	MEANING
Je	me	parle.			I talk to me / myself.
Je	te	parle.			I talk to you.
Je	lui	parle.			I talk to him. / her.
Je	nous	parle.			I talk to us.
Je	vous	parle.			I talk to you.
Je	leur	parle.			I talk to them.

CASE #2: VERB + « À » + ANYTHING ELSE

When referring to **ANYTHING ELSE**, use the PRONOUN « Y » [i]

SUBJECT	PRONOUN	VERB	« À »	ANYTHING ELSE	MEANING
Je		vais	à	l'école.	I go to school.
J'	y	vais.			I go there.

SUBJECT	PRONOUN	VERB	« À »	SOMEONE	MEANING
Je		pense	à	mon voyage.	I think about my trip.
J'	y	pense.			I think about it.
